FROM AMSAT DATED JULY 28, 1977

THE U.S.S.R. AMATEUR SYSTEM "RS"

AMSAT has received Circular No. 1273 dated July 12, 1977 of the International Telecommunication Union's International Frequency Registration Board giving advance publication information on a planned amateur satellite network of the U.S.S.R. The published aformation is summarized below.

General Information: "The U.S.S.R. Administration wishes to inform countries Members of the I.T.U. that the U.S.S.R. is working on the establishment of an amateur-satellite service system. This system "RS" will be based on 3-4 satellites on a circular near-polar orbit. The amateur satellite stations are designed for multiple access with retransmission and frequency translation without demodulation on a real time scale"

Date of bringing into use: 1977-1978. Number of Satellites: 3-4. Orbital Information: Inclination, 82°. Altitude of apogee & perigee, 950 km (circular orbit) Period, 102 minutes. Uplink characteristics: 145.8-145.9 MHz (100 kHz bandwidth) Half-wave transmitting antenna, circularly polarized transponder power, 1.5 watts peak to 0 dB gain ant. Maximum communications distance: 6,000 km (3,700 st. mi.)

From the advance publication orbital information, it seems likely that the "RS-OSCAR's" will be launched piggyback with the Meteor meteorological satellites from the Plesetsk launch site.

AMSAT welcomes this new series of Soviet amateur radio satellites in the spirit of international friendship and cooperation.

Greensboro Coliseum Greensboro, N.C.

A report on another Hamfest-Convention-Flea Market to most of the Cheest-Bits readers is very likely to draw a rousing Ho-Hum and not much more. However, Communications '77 deserves a faw words of mention, for I feel it was just enough different that it will attract a lot of attention in future years. Sponsors of the event were the Greensboro Amateur Radio Assoc., Morris Jeffrys, K4SNI, Pres, and the Greensboro Coliseum where the event was held.

The Coliseum is ideally suited for this type show, with good access and plenty of parking Sat-up was allowed the night before which is good for commercial operations and flea-marketers alike.

Lets take a look at the differences, and what made this show great. This show was the first to include CB, Broadcasters, Home Ent., Military, Computors all lumped in with Ham Radio. All this nicely balanced and spaced to allow for the better than 3000 crowd that was reported. FCC exams were given at intervals and it seemed applicants took the tests in waves. I did not get a count, but I would estimate several hundred at least. The planning, preparation, and the general overall courtesy of the folks running the show deserves a special mention, and is a tribute to the leadership of the show chairman, Hal Salter, WB4DCS. I was impressed with the charm of the people in N.C. including all those who were part of the committee.

I would have to say that this show is a sharp contrast to my experiences in Orlando, Florida where I had to wait for almost two hours to get tables I reserved more than a month previously. And then wait in two lines, one to verify that I had a reservation, and the accord to get the table assigned if it was available. The folks in Florida were very confused with conflicting information and instructions at every turn, a PA system either inaudible or blowing your head off, and a decided lack of courtesy or concern for the flea merchant or the visitor... The contrast at Greensboro was amazing. It is hard to believe that this was their first year because of the smoothness and the aura of professionalizm about the affair.

Look for the Greensbero convention to grow, and I am definitely planning to return next year. * * *






